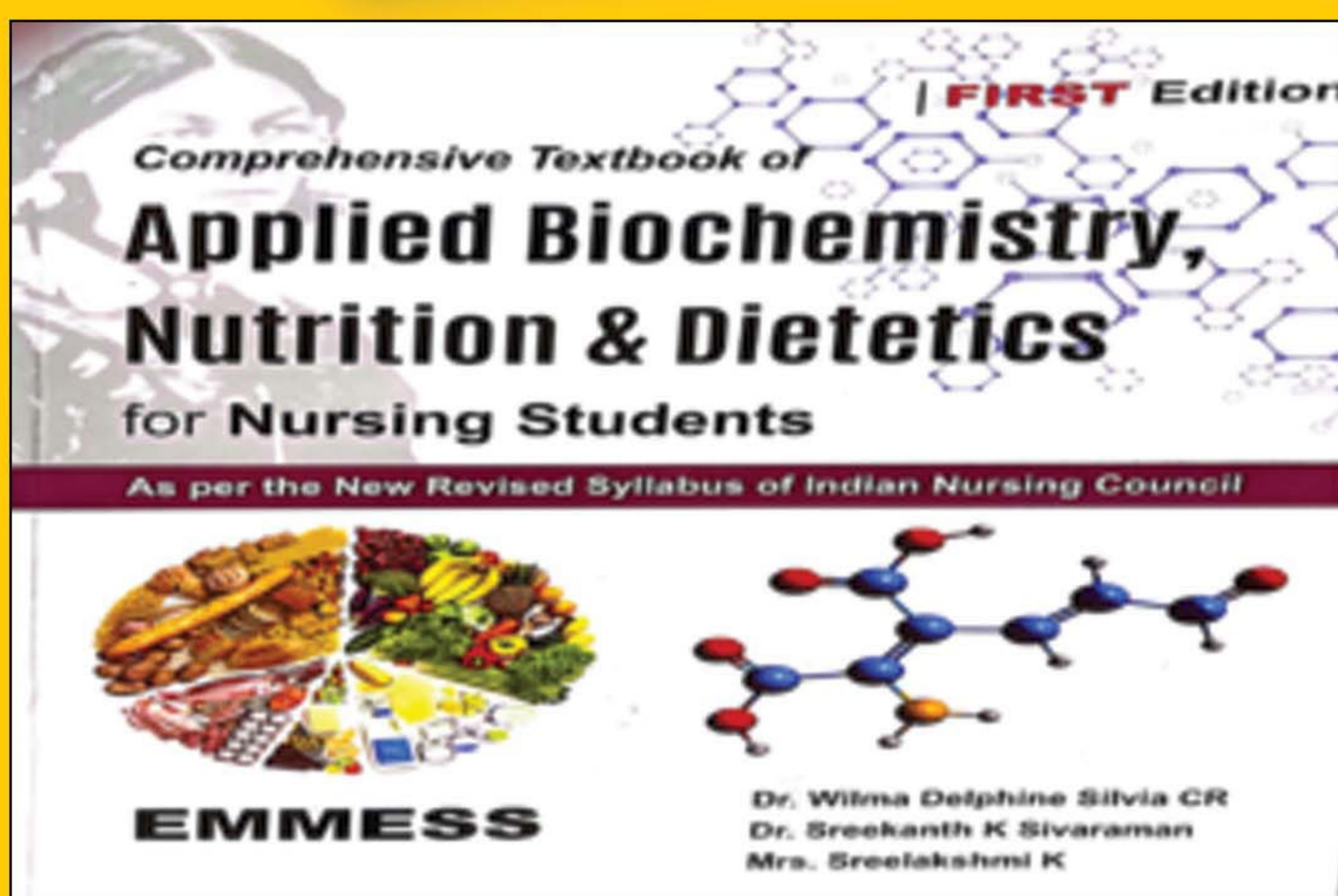
INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY



International Yoga Day celebration on 21st June, 2023

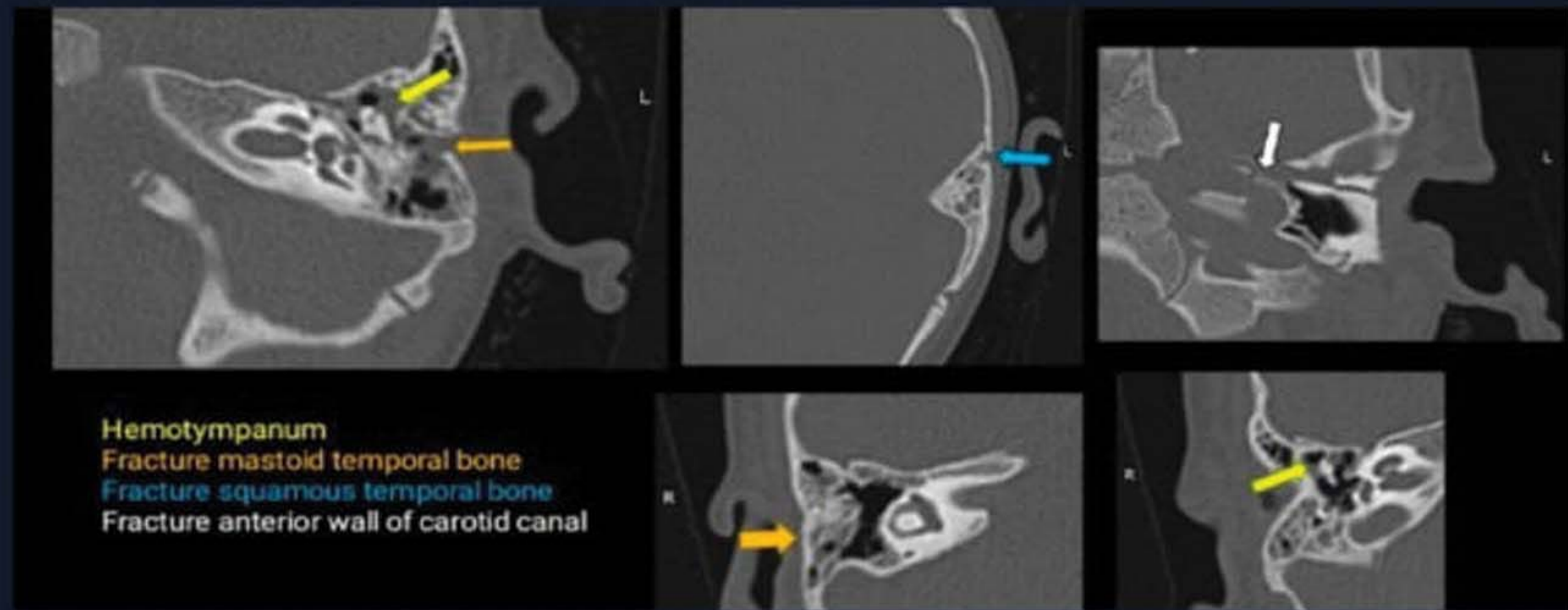

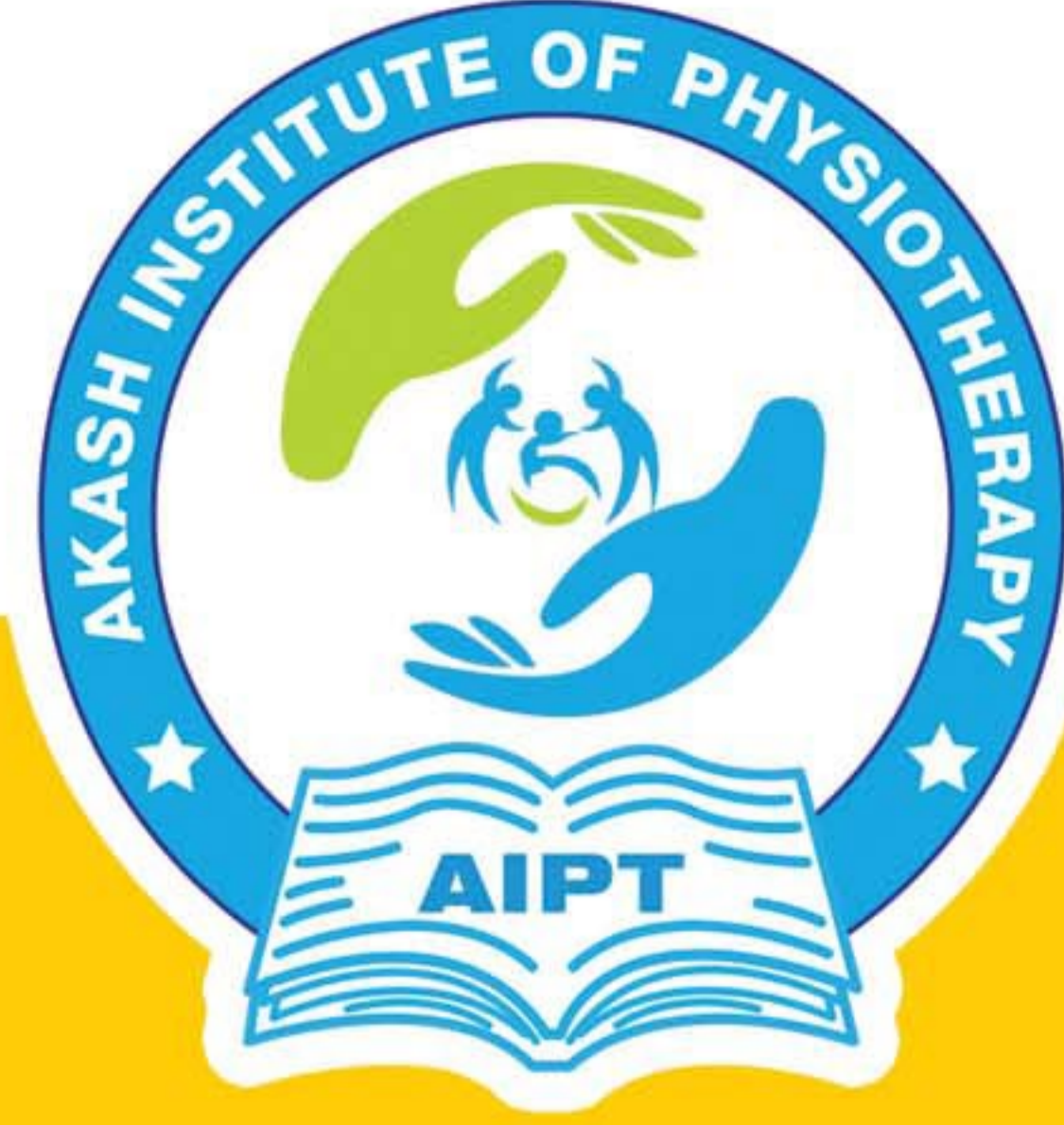

TESTIMONY

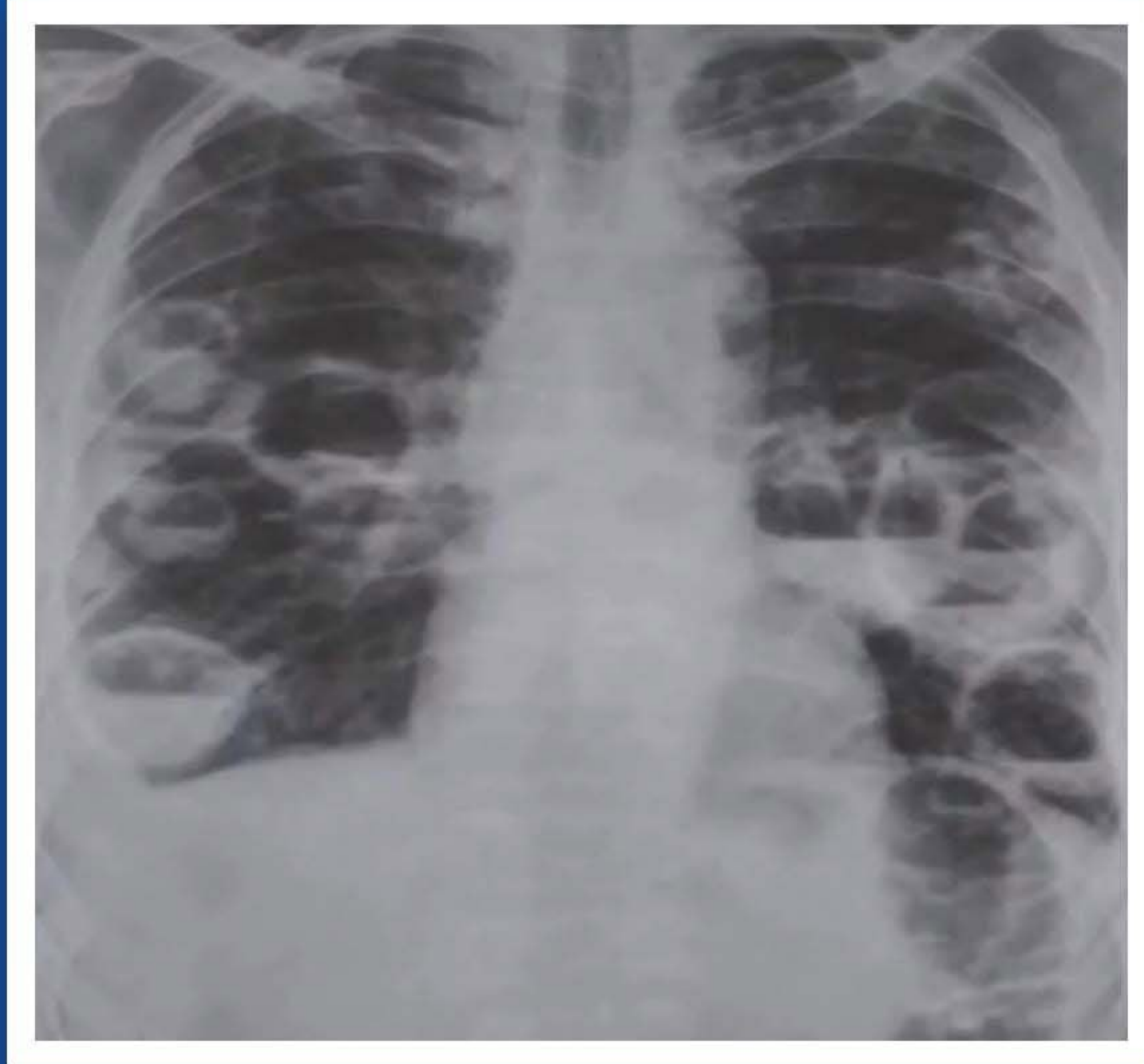
